NAIST Thailand Office 5th Anniversary Symposium

NAIST Thailand Office 5th Anniversary Symposium "NAIST and Thai Universities for Research and Education Collaboration Symposium 2022-Towards the Post-Pandemic New Normal" was held on September 6th, 2022. This symposium was organized to commemorate the 5th anniversary of the NAIST Thailand Office, which was established in March 2017 in the Faculty of Engineering at Kasetsart University as a central point in Asia for global collaboration in education and research. It was held in a hybrid format, onsite and online, and attracted about 100 participants.

In a post-pandemic situation where global mobility had become possible once again, from NAIST Prof. Jun Ohta (Vice President/Executive Director), Prof. Kenichi Matsumoto (Director of NAIST Thailand Office, Division of Information Science), Prof. Minoru Okada (Division of Information Science) and Prof. Hiroshi Takagi (Division of Biological Sciences) visited Bangkok to meet faculty members from partner institutions (Kasetsart University, Chulalongkorn University, Mahidol University, King Mongkut's University of Technology Thonburi and Chiang Mai University) and Thai alumni who are actively working worldwide including Japan and Thailand.


In the symposium, Prof. Ohta gave an opening address as a representative of NAIST. Then Dr. Peerayuth Charnsethikul, Dean of the Faculty of Engineering of Kasetsart University, gave a speech on behalf of Thai partner universities and expressed his expectations for future collaboration and further academic


In session 5, Prof. Matsumoto introduced the Thai Virtual Office with six Thai students who work as student assistants, who also introduced themselves.



Diplomatic Delegation Visits to NAIST

Australian Embassy Delegation Visit to NAIST (June 3, 2022) Ms. Janine Pitt, Counselor for Education and Research of Australian Embassy Tokyo, visited NAIST on June 3rd, 2022. Ms. Pitt introduced how Australian Government promotes international student mobility through the New Colombo Plan and the Destination Australian Program. She explained that Australia wants to increase student exchange between Japan and Australia through the above programs as well as through double degree programs. After the courtesy visit, the delegation visited the Ubiquitous Computing Systems Laboratory to see its Smart Home.



Ambassador of Israel to Japan visit to NAIST (June 8, 2022)

Mr. Gilad Cohen, Ambassador of Israel to Japan, visited NAIST on June 8th, 2022. Ambassador Cohen discussed how Israel promotes innovation creation as a nation and actively develops academiaindustry collaboration with NAIST executives. Israel also aims to strengthen ties with Japanese institutions and the Embassy offered to help in the conclusion of agreements with Israeli institutions. The delegation then visited the Division of Information Science Director, Prof. Michiko Inoue and Affiliate Prof. Fukuhito Ooshita introduced the Japan-Israel joint research project funded by JST, ICT for a Resilient Society, of which he was the principal investigator. In closing, they visited the Organic Electronics Laboratory.
