Measures concerning the new coronavirus (COVID-19) (June 18th announcement)

This is to announce that, with the lifting of the State of Emergency for the surrounding prefectures announced on June 21th, 2021, the limitation level for activities at NAIST was lowered from Level 2 (minimal limitations) to Level 1 (partial limitations), in accordance with the Guide for Limiting Activities to Prevent the Spreading of the New Coronavirus (COVID-19) Infection.

Following this change, research activities, subjects (lectures, seminars, practices), students entering the campus, meetings on campus and employee work format are still restricted, so please note the following guide

We ask that all students, faculty and staff to continue being careful of the spread of infection, strictly practice the basic infection prevention measures, refrain from non-essential outings, and refrain from gatherings involving eating and drinking with large amounts of participants or that last for long periods of time, as they have a high possibility of infection.

- Research activities

Research activities may be performed, but make efforts to avoid the 3 Cs (closed spaces, crowded places and close-contact settings) while continuing to practice the basic measures to prevent the spread of infection, beginning with maintaining personal distance, wearing a mask and hand hygiene.

- Subjects (lectures, seminars, practices)

Lectures should be held mainly online.

For seminars and practices, please follow the information and instructions of the division to which your laboratory belongs.

- Students entering the campus

Students may enter the campus, but make efforts to avoid the 3 Cs (closed spaces, crowded places and close-contact settings) while continuing to practice the basic measures to prevent the spread of infection, beginning with maintaining personal distance, wearing a mask and hand hygiene.

- Meetings on campus

In-person meetings may be held but make efforts to avoid the 3 Cs (closed spaces, crowded places and close-contact settings). Online participation in meetings is recommended.

- Employee work format

Working at home (teleworking) and staggered work schedules may be considered when they will not adversely affect education, research or employment duties.
